




Key Books

Pancake Day and Easter


To celebrate Pancake day we will follow recipes to make pancakes and taste healthy toppings.

We will read the easter story and learn about traditions. We will create our own easter patterns and use our numbers to search for and count numbered eggs.



Physical development

Fine Motor— The children will continue to learn to use tools and develop the hand strength to work towards a tripod grip. We will use cutlery to eat and cut our food.



Gross Motor Skills— We will learn to move our bodies in a variety of ways moving, over, under and through equipment. We will add actions to dances and support the children to recall patterns of movement.



Expressive Art and Design

Joining— We will continue to explore joining techniques and begin to apply these to 3D models

Printing—Mono-printing we will explore how to use different resources to print flowers and other pictures. We will use our imagination to create our own pictures.



Songs and Dance— We will learn nursery rhymes and songs linked to our stories. And explore how instruments can be used.

Communication and Language

Phonics—We will be listening carefully to sounds and beginning to play games with alliteration and voice sounds. We will listen carefully to the sounds and begin to talk about how sounds are different including fast/slow and quiet/loud

Helicopter Stories—the children listen to and create their own stories which are then acted out to the group.

Mathematics

Number— We will practice our accurate counting, making sure children are secure with the order of numbers and understand to count one item at a time. The children will begin to learn how to compare numbers knowing which group is more or fewer.

Shape— We will continue to reinforce the 2D shapes (circle, square, oblong, triangle)

Size—We will compare the size of objects using the language of tall, big, small and short to compare

Knowledge of the World

We will follow different recipes and explore what happens to different ingredients as they are mixed together. During our baking we will learn about simple hygiene and healthy food choices.



Building bridges— we will look at how bridges are made and how they can be used to keep people safe.
